# Edison Preparatory Middle School Summer Reading 2019 8<sup>th</sup> Grade

It is strongly suggested that all Edison Preparatory Middle School students turn in <u>four</u> Summer Reading Projects. Reading and writing during the summer helps students to stay on top of their skills and be reading for a new school year. The book lists and projects are listed below.

Each project is worth 100 points

- Project #1 points will be put in PowerSchool at the end of 1<sup>st</sup> guarter
- Project #2 points will be put in PowerSchool at the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter
- Project #3 points will be put in PowerSchool at the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter
- Project #4 points will be put in PowerSchool at the end of 4<sup>th</sup> quarter

## **Assigned Book and Project**

## Project #1 – Out of My Mind by Sharon Draper

Read the book and complete the activities below:

- 1. Cast a play for the book. List at least 10 characters from the book and assign an actor to play that role. Include a 2 sentence summary for each actor explaining why they would be a good fit for that character.
- 2. Choose one chapter from the book and rewrite it in play form.

### **Project #2 – Nonfiction**

Choose one of the following nonfiction books to read. Then, complete the assigned project.

- Lincoln's Grave Robbers by Steve Sheinkin
- The Story of My Life by Helen Keller
- Brown Girl Dreaming by Jacqueline Woodson
- Friday Night Lights by HG Bissinger
- Stolen Into Slavery by Judy & Dennis Fraden

#### **Project:**

Write or type a <u>Book Blog</u> on paper. It must be at least one page long. You must have at least three other people (parent, sibling, friend, etc.) comment on your Blog paper.

(A Blog is a piece of writing that gives your thoughts on a subject. In this case, give your informal thoughts on the events in the book.)

# Project #3 – 19th Century Classic

Choose one of the following 19<sup>th</sup> century classic novels to read. Then, complete the assigned project.

- The Adventures of Tom Sawyer by Mark Twain
- Little Women by Louisa May Alcott
- Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens
- The Time Machine by H.G. Wells

#### Project:

<u>Correspondence with Another Character</u> – Pretend you are one of the characters in the book. Write a letter (in first person point of view) to another character in the book. It must be at least one page long.

### Project #4 - One Last Book!

Choose one of the following novels to read. Then, complete the assigned project.

- The Clockwork Three by Matthew J. Kirby
- Ender's Game by Orson Scott Card
- The Boy at the Top of the Mountain by John Boyne
- The One Memory of Flora Banks by Emily Barr
- A book of your own choosing that is at least 150 pages long and not a graphic novel or anime.

#### **Project:**

Create a <u>Double Entry Journal</u> – Divide your page in the center from the top to the bottom. On the left side of the page, write 20 direct quotes from the book including the page number. On the right side of the page, write your reflections or thoughts about each of the quotes.
