Grading directions everyone will follow:



- 1. POWERSCHOOL STEP: If weights are used, go to PowerSchool and set those up first for each course.
 - If you use weights in your courses, go to PowerSchool and set up those weights you will have two weeks at the beginning of each semester to do that, and then the PowerSchool grade book will go into 'read-only' mode.


- 2.CANVAS STEP: (you will follow these steps for each course that synced into your account from PowerSchool)
 - Open Assignments: in the course navigation, click Assignments



• Import Assignment Groups: Click the Options menu [1], then click the Import Assignment Groups option [2].



Add Assignment Groups: In the Import Assignment Groups window, click the Add button.



View Imported Groups: View the groups imported from PowerTeacherPro. You will know it is an
assignment group that imported from PowerTeacher Pro because it will have the paper/arrow icon next to
the assignment group title.




Note: If an assignment group is not imported, the assignment group may not yet be verified for import. Try importing the groups again in 24 hours.


- 3. CANVAS STEP: If weights were created in PowerTeacher Pro, create those same weights in Canvas so that they match between both platforms.
 - To manage an assignment group, click the group's **Options** drop-down menu [1]. To edit the Assignment Group, click the **Edit** link [2].




• You can edit the Assignment Group name and the weighted percentage (if applicable).



- 4. Set up the nightly sync for Canvas to pass grades over to PowerSchool
 - Open Grades: In Course Navigation, select Grade Sync



• Select the Sync [1] tab at the top of the page



• Check the box that reads 'Scheduled Daily Sync' [3]

- Select the 'Save' button [4]
- Each time you set up a new assignment, place that assignment in the correct assignment group in Canvas. Assignment names must be 30 characters or less in order to pass back to PowerTeacher Pro, so keep your names abbreviated or shorter than 30 letters and spaces!
 - This is a step in the assignment setup process, but can also be changed when looking at the assignments tab assignments are drag and drop on that page in the course. Directions for moving assignments to a different group are <u>linked here</u>.

Overal things to know about grade passback from Canvas to PowerSchool:

Canvas passes back any assignment, graded discussion, or quiz that includes a checkmark in the Sync to SIS option. This option determines what assignments are sent to PowerSchool. The Sync to SIS option may already be selected for you; Canvas admins can enable an account-level setting that automatically enables all assignments, but you can still manually remove a checkmark from any assignment that you do not want to pass back to PowerSchool.

Additionally, Canvas assignments are also subject to the following details:

- Due dates are required to send an assignment to PowerSchool.
- All assignment names must be unique or they cannot be identified by PowerSchool. If a Canvas assignment has the same name as already exists in PowerSchool, Canvas will not push data for that assignment to PowerSchool.
- Canvas assignments assigned to individual students in a course or MasteryPaths via differentiated assignments do not post to PowerSchool. PowerSchool does not support this functionality. Assignments must be assigned for a specific section or for Everyone.
- Assignment names cannot be longer than 30 characters.

For PK/K and Montessori teachers only:

Add the grading scheme set up for your situation.

- There is a PK/K grading scheme and a Montessori grading scheme already available in Canvas. Follow the
 directions linked here to use that grading scheme in your Canvas course. In the 'Select Grading Scheme'
 step from the linked directions, select SY 20-21 PK/K or SY 20-21 Montessori. Teachers will need to do this
 in each of the courses synced in from PowerSchool.

Edmentum Courseware Steps:

• Students will complete their assignments in the Edmentum Courseware platform. Teachers will create 'no submission' assignments (<u>directions linked here</u>) in Canvas to match the Edmentum Courseware assignments and manually enter the grades received in Edmentum into the Canvas grade book.
