STEP ONE Begin the admission process online

STEP TWO

Complete admission

Submit the following documents to TCC enrollment services

- Current high school transcript with unweighted GPA, courses, grades, and units
- All test scores from the admission requirements approved list above

STEP THREE Check course placement eligibility

- If your scores do not the meet placement requirements below, then
 - Sign up online for national ACT, Pre-ACT, PSAT10, PSAT-NMSQ, or SAT
 - OR contact the TCC Testing Center 918-595-7534 for residual ACT information
 - OR meet with a TCC advisor for referral to the Accuplacer course placement tests

STEP FOUR

Complete the college enrollment form

- Pick up a TCC enrollment packet from your high school counselor or contact TCC
 Dual Credit and a packet will be emailed to you.
- Complete section 1A, B, & C of the enrollment form. Parent/guardian must sign even if student is 18 or older.
- Meet with your high school counselor. Discuss how college courses work with your schedule. The high school counselor will complete and sign section 2A, B, & C of the enrollment form.
 - All students must be on track to graduate from high school with their 9th grade cohort group and must not have graduated early.
 - All dual credit students must maintain a college GPA of 2.0 or above to enroll in subsequent semesters.

STEP FIVE

Submit your enrollment documents

- Enrollment documents include: High School Student College Enrollment Form, high school transcript (in a sealed envelope), and national test score records.
- If you live in Tulsa Co. and are enrolling in a course with a <u>section number</u> <u>beginning with 1, 2, 3, or 4</u>, take the documents to any TCC campus.
- If you live outside of Tulsa Co., and are enrolling in a course with a <u>section</u> <u>number beginning with 1, 2, 3, or 4</u>, your counselor may email the documents to enrollment@tulsacc.edu.
- If you are enrolling in a course with <u>a section number beginning with a 6,</u> your counselor will email the packet of documents to <u>dualcredit@tulsacc.edu</u>.

STEP SIX

Accept tuition waiver

- All students: When the semester begins, read and accept the terms and conditions and the award in the MYTCC financial aid dashboard to receive the tuition waiver. See <u>tuition waiver policy</u> for more information.
- Juniors: TCC provides 6 credit hours of free tuition to juniors each semester (summer after 10th, fall, and spring) who meet eligibility requirements.
- Seniors: Oklahoma provides 18 credit hours of free tuition to all seniors who meet eligibility requirements.

STEP SEVEN

> Pay your TCC account balance

- One-time admission fee of \$20 paid with first semester's enrollment (first-time entering students).
- Course fees vary based on credit hours, course delivery, course type, and course location, e.g. off-campus, on-campus*.
- Subsidized fees-Students who are eligible to receive and have applied for Oklahoma Promise should check with TCC or their high school counselor for available off-campus* fee reduction programs.
- Online technology fees are assessed for both subsidized and regular courses delivered online. Other special course fees may apply, e.g. science lab fees.
- Tuition amounts in excess of the tuition waiver if applicable.
- Payment: TCC accepts payment online or at any of the four main campuses' Bursar offices (Metro, West, Northeast, Southeast Campuses). Some high schools collect payments – check with your high school counselor.
- *Off-site TCC Campus Students attend courses held at an off-campus community site or at a high school embedded site.
- *On TCC Campus Students attend courses at a TCC campus or online courses hosted by one of the four main campuses.

Satisfactory academic progress

• College records are permanent; therefore, it's important to maintain your grades while at TCC, even while in high school. If a student's grades fall below the cumulative 2.0, they will not be allowed to re-enroll in the dual enrollment program. The failure to complete a certain percentage of classes may also affect future college financial aid awards. See tulsacc.edu financial aid policies for more information.
